Dear Dr. Rank.

My interest in, and study of, radiation injury (as relates to the Cash/Landrum case) continues.

In <u>Biological</u> <u>Effects</u> of <u>Radiations</u> by Grosch and Hopwood (Academic Press, N.Y., 1979), I found pp. 192-4 to be of particular relevance (please refer to enclosures). Unless I misunderstand Fig. 11.1 and the underlined statement on p. 194, prior to development of a chronic ulcer from a single exposure to ionizing radiation, one should expect the following progression to have occurred:

(a) Early erythema phase of approx. 2 days*
(b) Latent period of approx. 6 days*

(c) Main erythema phase of approx. 20 days*

(d) Pigmentation/melanization phase beginning approx. 21 days following exposure, lasting indefinitely

In the case of Vickie Landrum, as far as I can determine, her history seems compatible with phase (a), but I have seen no reports to indicate that phases (b) to (d) occurred. In fact, she seems to have suffered "loss of skin pigmentation" (MUFON UFO Journal Nov. 1981, p.5).

I realize that you cannot and will not divulge medical information regarding Vickie Landrum, but can you please answer the following question for me: If someone (not an albino) does $\underline{\text{not}}$ exhibit phases (b) to (d) following a claimed radiation exposure incident, can one confidently conclude that a subsequent skin ulcer in fact resulted from the claimed radiation exposure?

Also enclosed is an article from Science (date unknown) sent to me by Philip Klass for your perusal and comments. We wonder whether or not you are aware of any evidence of radiation damage to plants, grass, etc., in the vicinity of the Cash/Landrum incident. We have heard no reports of such.

I have not yet received the information relating to the dispute between APRO and VISIT with regard to this case, but I have recently once again requested such, from James Moseley. Again, if anything of relevance to our correspondence results from my inquiry, I will be happy to send it along.

Thank you for yours of January 15.
